1. Long Articles (7000-10000 words, inclusive of footnotes).
2. Short Essays/Notes (3000-7000 words, inclusive of footnotes).
3. Case Comments/Treaty Appraisal/Book or Article Review (2000-4000 words, exclusive of footnotes).

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

1. Each submission must be accompanied by an abstract of not more than 350 words.
2. The citation method to be followed is that of the Harvard Bluebook (19th edition).
3. Submissions received after the said deadline shall be considered for subsequent issues of the Journal, on a rolling basis.
4. Co-authorship up to two authors is permitted.
